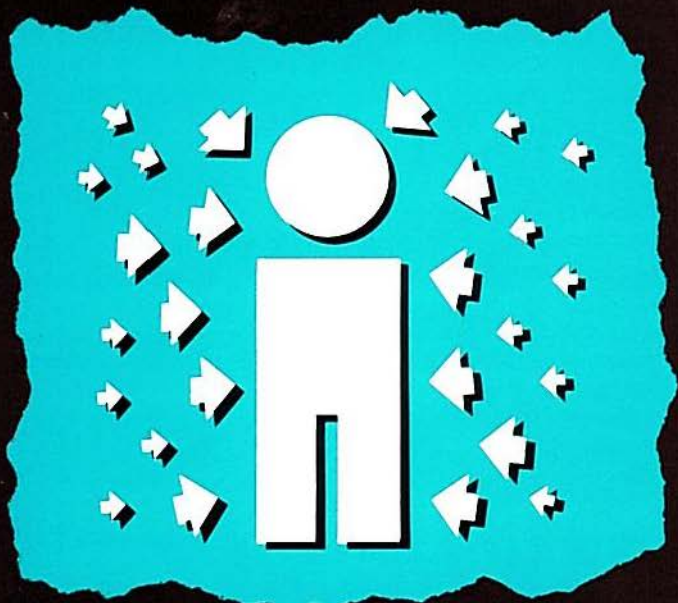

GENERAL INFORMATION

Objective
 The objective of this program is to provide the primary information with the most current update on the latest news on the Human Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS). We will discuss the historical aspect of Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome and progress to a discussion of the current outbreak of AIDS, its epidemiology and modes of transmission. Also included in the program will be a discussion of the implications for the high risk groups. Clinical presentations of opportunistic infections and malignancy (e.g. Kaposi's Sarcoma) will be presented, together with the nature of the latest defects and approaches to therapy. Ethical, socio-cultural issues will also be included. The program format will feature a series of lectures by leading faculty members selected because of their expertise on the subject. The program will conclude with a panel discussion with ample time for questions. Materials will be distributed.

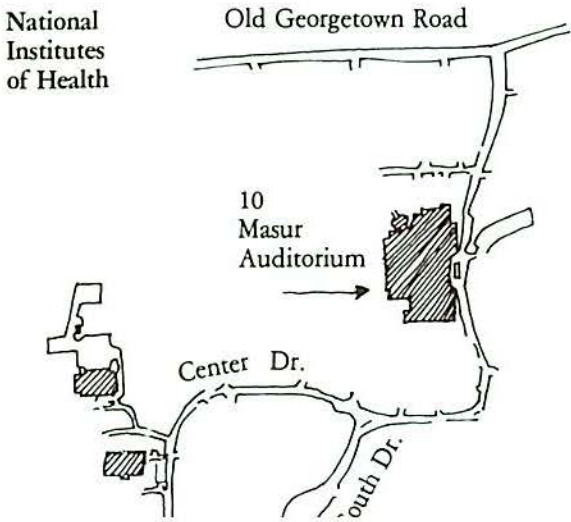
Location
